D.S.O - Medal Awards:

1st World War – Lieutenant Colonels



Distinguished Service Order – D.S.O

Instituted by Queen Victoria 6th September 1886, as a Naval and Military Order of Distinction. Designated the Distinguished Service Order, for the purpose of rewarding individual instances of meritorious or distinguished service, by officers of the armed forces in wartime.

Ribbon: Red with Blue edges



Lieutenant Colonel: Percy Archer **Clive**, D.S.O, Twice Mentioned in Despatches, 1st Battalion Grenadier Guards Commanding 1st/5th Battalion Lancashire Fusiliers. Died: 4th April 1918. Aged 35. Member of Parliament for South Herefordshire constituency since 1908. Son of Charles Mersey Bolton Clive and Lady Catherine; Husband of Alice Muriel Clive. Awarded the Legion of Honour (France) and Croix de Guerre. Listed in Bay 1, Arras Memorial, Pas de Calais. France.

Lieutenant Colonel: W. D. **Drury-Lowe**, D S O, 1st Battalion Grenadier Guards. Died: 25th September 1916. At Rest: Guards Cemetery, Lesboeuufs, Somme, France. Buried: Plot VII, Row A, Grave 6

Lieutenant Colonel: Edward Henry **Trotter**, D S O, Grenadier Guards attached to 18th Battalion, The King's (Liverpool Regiment). Killed in action 8th July 1916. Aged 44. Son of Major General Sir. H. Trotter and the Honourable Lucy Trotter. At Rest: Peronne Road Cemetery, Maricourt, Somme, France. Buried: Plot IV, Row H, Grave 28
