Son of John Wigram Shephard and Ysolt Shephard, Husband of Diana Shephard, of Lochearnhead, Perthshire. Buried in Plot V, Row N, Grave 6
Sloan	J.K.W.	165003	Lieutenant	6th	K.A	North Africa	17-Mar-1943	24	Sfax War Cemetery, Tunisia	Believed shot and killed whilst under attack, on/near Mareth Line. Son of Robert A. W. and Jean Knox Sloan, of Elshieshields, Dumfriesshire. Buried in Plot III, Row BB, Grave 12
Slob (M.C)	A.	306838	Lieutenant	1st	K.A.S	North West Europe	23-Feb-1945	-	Jonkerbos War Cemetery, Gelderland, Netherlands	Believed killed when Tank ran into his jeep, Battle Accident, near Nijmegen bridge. Son of Mr. and Mrs. A. Slob, of Sneek, Friesland, Holland. Buried in Plot 18, Row A, Grave 4
Snell	C.V.I.	200080	Lieutenant	5th	K.A	Italy	27-Jun-1944	22	Bolsena War Cemetery, Italy	Believed killed by Mine laid under bridge, at River Arno. Son of Ivan Edward and Marjory Snell, of Hayling Island, Hampshire. Buried in Plot III, Row C, Grave 5
Stokes-Roberts (M.C)	G.R.	233183	Lieutenant	6th	K.A	Italy	22-Jan-1944	21	Minturno War Cemetery, Italy	Believed killed by Mortar Bombs, near Minturno. Son of Arthur Edward and Evelyn Winifred Stokes-Roberts, of Stratford-on-Avon, Warwickshire. Buried in Plot IV, Row J, Grave 22

Son of Major Sir Samuel Strang Steel, 1st Battalion, and the Hon. Lady Strang Steel, of Philiphaugh, Selkirkshire. Buried in Plot III, Row AA, Grave 19
Streatfeild-Moore	T.E.	233181	Lieutenant	3rd	D.W	Italy	5-Aug-1945	24	Udine War Cemetery, Italy	Believed died as a result of wounds received by accident. Son of Alexander McNeill Streatfeild-Moore, and of Evelyn A. G. Streatfeild-Moore, of Newbury, Berkshire. Buried in Plot III, Row B, Grave 12
Stucley	L.R.C.	47661	Major	Grenadier Guards	D.A.S	North Africa	16-Sep-1943	32	Bone War Cemetery Annaba, Algeria	201st Guards Brigade. Believed to have taken ill with Diphtheria, and later died in hospital. Son of Major Humphrey St. Ledger Stucley, Grenadier Guards (killed in action in Belgium), and of Rose Stucley, of Windsor, Berkshire. Buried in Plot VII, Row A, Grave 17
