Thomas	R.D.D.	247081	Lieutenant	3rd	K.A	Italy	3-Aug-1944	22	Arezzo War Cemetery, Italy	Killed between 2nd - 3rd August 1944. Believed shot by sniper in courtyard of castle, during attack at River Arno. Son of Lt. Meredith Dillon Thomas, M.C., M.A. (formerly of Grenadier Guards), and Rachel Marion Dalzell Thomas, of Sherborne, Dorset. Buried in Plot VI, Row A, Grave 8
Thornton	D.H.B.	100546	Major	H.Q London	K.A.S	London	18-Jun-1944	36	Golders Green Crematorium, Hendon, Middlesex	Killed by Flying Bomb on Guards Chapel. Husband of Rosemary Thornton, of Marylebone, London. Listed on Panel 3
Thwaites	T.A.	247082	Lieutenant	5th	K.A	Bagnoregio	12-Jun-1944	20	Bolsena War Cemetery, Italy	Carrier Platoon Officer, believed killed by land mine at Bagnoregio. Son of Colonel Norman Graham Thwaites, C.B.E., M.V.O., M.C., and Eleana Whitridge Thwaites. Buried in Plot I, Row A, Grave 3
Trenchard	Hon H.	186879	Lieutenant	6th	K.A	North Africa	17-Mar-1943	21	Sfax War Cemetery, Tunisia	Believed wounded by land mine, then killed during following Mortar Fire near Mareth Line. Son of Marshal of the Royal Air Force Hugh Montague Trenchard, G.C.B., O.M., G.C.V.O., D.S.O., 1st Viscount Trenchard, and of Viscountess Trenchard (nee Bowlby), of Walton-on-Thames, Surrey. Buried in Plot II, Row BB, Grave 5
Trimmer-Thompson	C.E.A.	200081	Lieutenant	6th	K.A	North Africa	17-Mar-1943	-	Sfax War Cemetery, Tunisia	Believed killed by Mines, near Mareth Line. Buried in Plot II, Row AA, Grave 8
Tufnell	H.J.	165020	Lieutenant	6th	K.A	North Africa	11-Mar-1943	22	Sfax War Cemetery, Tunisia	Believed killed when his Jeep ran over a mine, near Medenne. Son of Hugh Carleton Charsley Tufnell and Kathleen Margaret Tufnell. Buried in Plot VII, Row D, Grave 7
