<p>The father of one joined the Army in 2009 and deployed to Afghanistan for the first time on April 5 this year. His family said: "Karl was one in a million. He was a proud and caring man who took pride in whatever he did. "The family are obviously devastated. Karl was the light of many lives and touched all who knew him. "He will be especially missed by his baby daughter Grace, who has lost her number one man.</p> <p>" L/Colonel James Bowder, Commanding Officer of 1st Battalion Grenadier Guards, described Guardsman Whittle as "one of our very best. A great soldier and a young man of rare character, he was destined to go a very long way in the Army. "Big, strong and full of fight, he battled hard against his injuries to the very end. His loss has been keenly felt in a close Battalion, and our prayers are with his family at this most difficult of times." He added: "I am immensely proud of what Guardsman Whittle achieved out here in Afghanistan and more broadly during his military career. "He was utterly committed to his fellow guardsmen, his company and the mission. He will never be forgotten by either the battalion or the broader regimental family." After completing his combat training, Guardsman Whittle spent time conducting public duties at the Royal Palaces and taking part in state ceremonial tasks with Nijmegen Company, Grenadier Guards. In August 2011, he joined 1st Battalion as part of Three Platoon, The Queen's Company, later deploying to Afghanistan.</p>

Wilkinson	Dave	-	Sergeant	1st	-	1-Jul-2007	33	Unknown	<p>Sergeant Wilkinson, from Ashford, Kent, was serving with the 1st Battalion Grenadier Guards at the time of the attack in which four other soldiers were injured. The patrol was engaged by small arms fire and rocket propelled grenades after leaving base in the town of Gareshk, in Helmand province, Afghanistan. Sergeant Wilkinson, known as "Pidge", joined the army in 1993 serving with the 19th Regiment, Royal Artillery. He had previously served in Gibraltar, Turkey, Norway, the Balkans and Iraq.</p>
<p>His commanding officer, Lieutenant Colonel Will Bramble, said: "Sergeant Wilkinson excelled as a soldier. "Clearly passionate about his trade, he contributed widely to the regiment and was held in the highest regard by all those who knew him. His selfless nature and wry wit made him extremely popular." Defence Secretary Des Browne said Sergeant Wilkinson was a "particularly experienced and professional soldier".</p>
