Davis	Reginald	2621415	Acting Sergeant	4th	-	21-Aug-1940	-	-	Information supplied by Colin White, grandson of Reginald. He is understood to have served in the 4th Battalion and 6th Armoured Brigade. Paperwork in Colin's possession indicates Reginald being de-mobbed in Ratzeburg, Germany on 11th June 1946, whilst in the post of Acting Sergeant. Also understood to have been in the Tank Brigade (Churchill Mk11's), of the 6th Armoured Division. Reginald is understood to have passed away in 1977.
				Photograph is an Example of the Churchill Mk IICS; c/w 3" howitzer in turret, 2 pdr in hull, few were built. This was followed by the Mk III in March 1942 c/w 6 pdr and new welded turret. Churchill Mk IV followed which was similar to the Mk III but with cast turret and 6 pdr. Early versions had Mk5 6 pdr with counterweight on end. Churchill Mk IV (NA75) followed and used by 1st Army in North Africa fitted 120 Mk IV's with M3 75 mm and mantlets from wrecked Shermans. Used in Sicily and Italy to 1945. 84: 75 mm. A Gun Carrier, 3", Mk I, Churchill: 24 vehicles mounted with 17 pdr but was never used. Churchill Mk V followed and was like the Mk IV but with 95 mm howitzer. Only 10% of Churchills had 95 mm as main gun on Churchill Mk VII, all existing Mk IV's were converted to Mk VII's.
